Located 900 feet from the University Guest House, Fort Douglas was built following the civil war to keep watch over the Salt Lake area to ensure that the early pioneers did not secede from the United States. The majority of the original structures are still intact and preserved by the University of Utah, the US Army Reserve, and the Fort Douglas Museum.

C Trail head into Rocky Mountains

Located in the University of Utah's backyard. A trail head leading into the Rocky Mountains is only a five to ten minute walk away. These trails lead to the Red Butte reservoir. There are clear views of the entire Salt Lake area, which are especially beautiful in the spring and fall.

D Natural History Museum of Utah
